Scott due at Christmas also Cash on hand Twelve dollars which he has received we also find the said Robert Cleveland's Accounts against said Dec'd for Taxes paid in different years amount to \$7.12 1/2 The P. Robert charges for his services. \$87 1/2

Berjamin Stephen Hayden Nelson Rec'd from Robert Cleveland Guardian of George Cleveland now dec'd the within estate reported by the commissioners within man is to be in the hands of the said Guardian except the \$500 paid R. Southgate also a negro girl named Pasture Barnes a Girl Boy named Levi of the estate of the dec'd which I promise to account for to those who are entitled there to so as to exempt the said Robert who is about leaving the State of Kentucky from any liability therefor sealed 1817 Elmore Scott Seal Witness R. The Last Will & Testament of Robert Stubbs deceased June the twentieth 1815

I design this as my last Will & Testament, Vids I leave the wealth to my son Richmond Robert Stubbs & my Daughter Elizabeth Stubbs who are on Bengall at Fort Williams near the Mouth of the Ganges, each only one dollar as they have already been well provided for & to my sons John Grant Stubbs, James Robert Stubbs & my Daughter Harriet Stubbs equally, my personal estate & my lands in Boone County, also in Mercer County to be divided among, but my land in Campbell County, as follows to wit a tract of 100 acres to be divided into 100 Dollars per acre or upwards

263 is to be sold & the money arising there from to be divided in the following manner Videlicet to John Grant Stubbs three thousand four hundred Dollars, to James Robert Stubbs two thousand nine hundred Dollars & to my Daughter Harriet Stubbs two thousand nine hundred Dollars & to my Wife Sarah Stubbs two hundred Dollars per annum during her natural life to be paid to her quarterly fifty dollars in Advance in lieu of her thirds which pay ment must be well secured to her previous to the sale of this Land in order to prevent any misunderstanding of this my last will & Testament I fear thee observe from the natural fertility of the soil, the manifold salubrious & medicinal springs of fresh Water & also of salt Water on or in this Land the great & Publick road extending thro' this Land its proximity to two great & navigable rivers the picking of this I tell so its proximity to three important & well be known important towns namely Newport Covington and Cincinnati, the time is not far distant when this Farm will command one hundred Dollars per Acre & upwards I wish this case, should my Land be sold the above mentioned Ratio is to be strictly adhered to, in the division among my said Children

Now to the most important point of all points I give to you my Children, this Valedictory advice that you study & endeavour to practice the precepts laid down in Gods holy word, the Scriptures, because in them you will find eternal life, that felicity, which this world neither can give, nor take away. Affirm belief in them with your greatest consolation, at home & abroad, by night & by day in sickness & in health, in prosperity & adversity. Keep up a free communion with your father & your God, & then you will associate with the highest, the Lord of Lords, the King of Kings the only ruler of Princes, the beginning being & all beings Shun all skeptical profane, & distasteful & theistical company, read the most precious books study the Scriptures by night & by day, investigate them for the more they are impartially investigated the more their truth will appear, but know by full experience, I have read weighed & experienced all the most weighty Arguments on every side of the question, I know they are no idle tale, should to God I had always known this, I then I would have shunned many rocks shoals & quicksands in my voyage of journey here below

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I wish to bequeath my Curious walking stick, which I set to my old worthy friend Major General John S. Gano, were it a captive bespangled with death on all, his hand is worthy to wear it, for he is a man of honor.

Like the mariners tempt at last on the tempestuous Ocean off for sixty two years, I say that I am fast approaching the harbor of rest, where I shall bid a final adieu to an extensive & extensive world, on which Ocean I would not wish to disembark, unless I could be assured of uninterrupted felicity & ever prosperous gales but those alone can be found in a future & better world, in the fruition of my God, by the all attaining Merit of the divine Attributes of Mercy & love manifested unto me, in the personage of Jesus Christ the Anchor of my soul on whom I have cast my weary & aching head & shall enjoy joys unspokeable & full of glory thro' the endless ages of eternity. Amen.

A few words more & I shall be done endeavour to preserve inviolate our Constitution or most excellent form of government, in prospect on the tender minds of your offspring & that they also to improve it on the minds of their offspring. So on forever, if all parents would be so, our form of government will stand as long the world will endure Robert Stubbs Esq.

This last Will & Testament of Robert Stubbs deceased was produced in Court December Term 1817 by Joseph Kennedy & Daniel Mays two of the executors there in named, I was proved according to Law by the Oaths of Andrew Lewis & Israel White subscribing Witnesses & it is ordered to be recorded & on the motion of the said Joseph Kennedy & Daniel Mays the 2. two executors whomade oath there to & together with Evans Doer & James Taylor their security entered into & Acknowledged their bonds in the penalty of twenty thousand Dollars conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate in due form.

In the name of God Amen I Alexander Turner of the County of Campbell & State of Kentucky, being in a low state of health but perfect in mind. I memory best calling to mind the frailty of mortals & that all have to die I ask to touching such things as it hath pleased God to bequeath unto me in this world I wish to dispose of in the following manner to wit

First I leave to my Brother Reuben Turner one half of my land that is due me for services rendered in the United States War when at War with Great Britain also one half of the money that is due me as a pension from the United States of America also one half of all my other monies due me in Virginia and all & every of the other half I leave to my sister Julia Turner for her to have & enjoy as soon as it can be collected In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 14th day of July 1817
