In the name of God Amen. I Samuel Swing
of Campbell County and State of Kentucky being much
debilitated in body but sound in memory and
understanding thanks to be to the giver of all good gifts
for the last though not the best of his temporal
mortal. Do make certain declaration and pronounce
this instrument to be my last will and testament
revoking all others I make. All my debts I
wish to be speedily and punctually paid so soon as
the nature of the same will admit and the legacies
herein after bequeathed are to be discharged as soon
as circumstances will permit and in the manner
hereinafter. It is my will also that all my debts
shall be paid out of my personal estate or so much
thereof to be sold for that purpose as will be
necessary or can be spared from the common use
of the family and if this should prove insuffi-
cient the balance to be made by the sale of two lots
with their appurtenances which I hold in the town
of Cincinnati State of Ohio or so much thereof
as will answer the purpose intended.
Item it is also my will and desire that the
tract of land which I hold on the bank of the
Ohio river and immediately above the mouth

Lot in the State of Indiana be equally divided
between my six sons viz David, James, Jeremiah, Sam-
uel, William and Abraham on the provision that
as may best suit so soon as the younger of them shall
arrive at the age of twenty one years. Item It is
further my will and desire that the tract of land
whereon I now reside shall be held for the use of my
surviving family until the youngest of my children
arrive at the age of twenty years after which
time and as soon as practicable it shall be divided
amongst them male and female agreeable to the
law regulating assets and furthermore all my
other property real or personal not already given or
otherwise disposed of shall stand in the name and
apportionment in all cases to the widow her
right of dower. Item It is my will also that
one third of that part which may be allotted to my
eldest daughter Betsey now Betsey Randall mar-
ried to the second husband shall descend to her eldest
child Marcus Collins in perpetuity and lastly I do
constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife
Mary Swing, David Swing & James Swing, execu-
tors of this last will and testament.
In which I hope & trust no disputes will arise con-
cerning the devise. But if contrary to expectation the
case should be otherwise my will and direction expressly
is that all disputes if any unhappily should arise shall be
decided by three impartial persons and in litigation men chosen
for their probity & good understanding two to be chosen
by the disputants & the third by those two which shall
never influenced by law or legal constructions shall decide the
meaning of the testator. In testimony of all which I have
herein contained I have hereunto set my hand and seal
