

July 14th 1821 I Thomas Kennedy of the Town of Covington County of Campbell and State of Kentucky being in perfect health of sound and dispassionate mind and memory, thanks to the Good God do make this my last Will and Testament - My just debts and funeral expenses being first paid, I give and devise the following legacies to my son Joseph Kennedy as he has had the benefit of my farm and gave a number of years and owes me a considerable sum which I hereby remit and discharge from payment I bequeath the sum of One hundred Dollars - To Thomas D Kennedy as he has already received seven hundred and fifty dollars the fourth son of my deceased wife - To Alfred Davis Hannah Eliza Nancy and Sally children to Joseph Kennedy aforesaid One thousand Dollars each to be put to interest, the interest to be paid to interest likewise and paid to each one respectively, male at the age of twenty one and female at eighteen years - To Sally Hyde Fifty dollars - To Mary Scott wife to James Scott Fifty dollars - To Peggy Pinckel widow of Jacob Pinckel Fifty dollars - To Jane Know wife to Henry Know Fifty dollars - To Nancy Know daughter of said Henry one hundred dollars - My real Estate to be sold or rented at the discretion of my executors - My personal Estate to be sold and the proceeds of both sales to be distributed as follows, One moiety to the heirs of William Pater by his wife Hannah - the other half to be equally divided between my sons Joseph and Samuel, Joseph's part to be exclusive of the hundred dollars already mentioned - The residue of my Black land bonds mortgages and bank notes if any will if he divides equally between my son Samuel to be disposed of as he sees fit and the time of William Pater appointed by his said wife Hannah to be distributed in the manner and form already mentioned in the case of Joseph's children - It is further my Will and Pleasure that if any of my said Sons die before they come to the age above mentioned their part shall be divided among the remaining brothers and sisters equally, the interest of said bonds and mortgages to be applied to the payment of the aforesaid legacies - It is further my Will that my Negroes may be hired or sold the following terms at which time they shall be free, Maria to be sold during life, for the first day of May 1827. Abt the first day of January 1828, Nancy the first day of January 1840, John the first day of January 1842, should the female have children they are to be free, male at the age of twenty two, female twenty two, a Record of their age to be made in the County Court within one month after their birth and in some manner then posteriorly each one to have a good indent of freedom written the female to have a bed valued at fifty dollars at the expiration of their servitude - Nancy Kennedy wife to Thomas D Kennedy is to have Little Black Nancy during her term of servitude. The proceeds from the sale of said Negroes or their sale to be divided in the same manner as my other Estate - Further I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph and James Kennedy and

William Pater to be my Executors of this my last Will and Testament to carry it into execution according to the true intent and meaning thereof as I have considered no law character and am unacquainted with law terms or technical phrases, should any misunderstanding arise it to be settled by the Juries from whom decision there shall be no appeal - Written with my own hand and sealed with my seal the day and year above written. Signed sealed and declared as my last Will and Testament - Note the word "sold" in the first page third line from the bottom - The word "written" in the fifth line from the bottom in the second page - The word "year" in the last page in the fourth line from the bottom intended before signing.

The last Will and Testament of Thomas Kennedy deceased was this day produced in Court and Alexander Connelley and William Barnes subscribing Witnesses, to said Will being duly sworn severally declared that the whole of the said Will including the name of the said Thomas Kennedy is wholly in the handwriting of the said Thomas Kennedy, and the said Barnes, and Connelley also severally declared that the said Will was acknowledged by him the said Thomas before them to be his last Will and Testament - And that the said Alexander Connelley and William Barnes accordingly subscribed their names as witnesses thereto in the presence of him the said Thomas Kennedy, whereof It is ordered that the said Will be read - Joseph Kennedy one of the executors named in the last Will and Testament of Thomas Kennedy aforesaid appeared in Court and refused to act as one of the Executors of the last Will and Testament of - And on the motion of Samuel Kennedy and William Pater the remaining two Executors named in said last Will and Testament who made oath and together with James Scott and Thomas Pater their securities executed and acknowledged their bond in the sum of \$100,000 conditioned as the Law directs a habeas corpus is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form - Before John A. Gane, John Anderson, William Barnes, and Edward Weeks being
