The commissioners appointed to settle the Guardian Ship of Thomas Sandford by Love Clave and returned into Court their report in the words Figures following to wit. According to an Order from the County Court of Campbell W the undersigned appointed as Commissioners to examine & settle with the Administrators of the Estate of Love Clave and decd as far as relates to his Guardianship over his ward Thomas Sandford & having carefully examined his Accounts on both sides exhibited & proven by witnesses duly qualified & such other evidence as was produced before us touching the Subject matter under consideration find that the estate of the afore said Clave and stands indebted to

Thomas Sandford his late ward in the sum hundred eighty six Dollars together with Interest thereon from the beginning of the year 1809 (the Termination of the Guardian ship) to the date here of amounting \$79. 98 Cents for seven years & 8 Months & do report the same Accordingly & where as it was suggested by the Adm of the afore said decd that compensation ought to be allowed for business rendered by him as Guardian & the commissioners and conceiving it to be their duty to act in this business but that the County Court have the sole power of fixing the Compensation to Guardians. Ordered that the said compensation be fixed at \$13. 35 Cents.
