The 14th day of April 1806 Walter Brueger being weak of body but of sound and perfect understanding Called upon us to witness his last Will and Testament which he made Verbally as follows first he requested his black slave to be sold for Money to Clear out his land. 2^d he gave his Spot of land to his Wife. 3^d he gave his Slave yearling then colt out of the Spot of land to his son John. 4th he gave his two year old ^{pony} colt out of the Mare known by the name of Bucket to his son William. 5th the rest of his Estate he left in his Wife's hands to raise his Children upon. 6th after his Children is Raised he requested that what ever was left of the Estate should be Equally divided amongst his Children and let his Wife to have an Equal part with them.
