 live on and raise and maintain my children
 untill they come of age or marry and then I
 Direct it to be sold and money arising from
 the sale to be Equally Divided amongst my
 children or their heirs if any of them should
 not be living Receiving never the less the
 Third of said Tract including the mansion house
 and Plantation for the use of my Wife for life
 unless she should chuse to sell her Order
 and and join in the conveyance which I
 Direct to be made by my Executors In Teste
 many others of I have subscribed my name
 and do declare and publish this as my last will &
 Testament this 1st Day of December 1804
