The 14th day of April 1806 Walter Brueger being weak of body but of sound and perfect understanding Called upon us to witness his last Will and Testament which he made Verbally as follows first he requested his black slave to be sold for Money to Clear out his land. 2^d he gave his Spot Slave to his Wife. 3^d he gave his Slave yearling mare colt out of the Spot Mare to his son John. 4th he gave his two year old ^{mare} colt out of the Mare known by the name of Buckshot to his son William. 5th the rest of his Estate he left in his Wife's hands to Raise his Children Upon. 6th after his Children is Raised he requested that what ever was left of the Estate should be Equally divided Amongst his Children and let his Wife to have an Equal part with them.

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I Alexander Adams of the county of Christian and
State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of
this mortal life and being of sound and perfect
mind and memory do make and publish this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form
following (that is to say) First it is my will and des-
ire that the tract of land on which I now live be
sold together with all my Personal Property not
herein otherwise disposed of at bequeathed the sale
to take place so soon after my decease as convenient
may point out and it is my desire that my Exe-
cutors demand only such part of aforesaid sundries my
not interfere with an adjoining claim commonly
called Chaughans it is my will and desire that
one half of the Purchase Money for said Land be paid
in one year after the day of sale the residue of the
Expiration of six years after the sale all my Per-
sonal Property sold agreeably to the Direction herein
given to be sold at a credit of one year from the sale
I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Rebecca
Adams one third of the whole amount of the money
arising from the sale of said Land to be paid out after
first payment thereof I also give unto my said wife
one Negro Woman named Violet forever and one Negro girl
named Dice During the life of my said wife and at her
Death her and her issue forever to my Children I mon-
-ever give unto my said wife one gray Mare and all
my household and Kitchen furniture
I give and bequeath unto my son William one Negro
Boy named Thomas I give unto my other son Thom-
-as one Negro Girl named Clara it is further
my will that all my just Debts be paid and
all my Lands cleared of the State price and

and any other incumbrances out of the
money arising from the sale aforesaid
and the residue applied to support
and Educate my Children I will and I
give all my lands the tract on which I
live bequeathed to said sons to be Equally
Divided between them having regard
regard to quantity and quality in the Division
Lastly I do hereby appoint my Brother Nathl
Adams and my friend Jacob Walker both
of the County and State aforesaid Executors
to this my last Will and Testament hereby
revoking all former Wills or wills by me
made in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this 14th Day of
March in year of our Lord 1808
