of 30 negroes price to be divided (after all my law-
ful debts and funeral expenses is discharged) is
to equally divided amongst my beloved children
namely Robert, Hugh William John Elizabeth
Elinor & Ester - Bond
 - 4 The balance of curds is to be equally divided
amongst my three daughters Elizabeth
Elinor and Ester -
- and I do appoint my friends Thomas Garrison
and William McMillan to be my Execu-
tors of this my last will and Testament
