I James Calvin of Christiana County and State of Kentucky, being very feeble and weak, of perfect mind and memory, thank be to God, calling unto me the Attorneys of my law, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, I will, fully and of full age, I give and bequeath unto my soul into the hands of Almighty God that I have in my last Will and Testament, and my body I have bequeathed to the Church to be buried in the Burial Place at the Burial Ground of my Brethren, Nothing Doubting but that the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God & His Son Jesus Christ, who will call me to his Kingdom where with it shall please God to bless me in this life, I Give and bequeath and assign of the same in the following manner, to wit:

First my Will and desire is that all my debts should be paid out of my Estate, that one tract of land lying on the Road of Old Creek in Hardin County, should be sold for the best price that can be had. 2nd I Give and bequeath after my debts being paid, unto my wife, all my real Estate during her Natural life, and after her death, my Will and desire is that my son

Calvin shall have one dollar out of
my estate. Also my Daughter Rachel
Hannan shall have One dollar out
of my estate, then the remainder part
of my estate to be sold and divided as
follows, that is Equally between my
undernamed Children, Elizabeth
Hannan, Nancy James, Moses, Ann
May, Esther, Susannah, Sarah
William and Charles, by them freely
to be signed and Enjoined, and I
in fully Revoked and Disannulled
former Wills and Testaments, Also
my Will and assign that my wife
Susannah, Calvin and John Brown
be the Executors of this my last
Will and Testaments, In Witness Whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this 21st day of February in the
year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and three, Signed sealed &
