 my other little Furniture, and the

 and heirs, and all my money that is in
 hand, and that same money that is in
 otherwise if any then he shall my place
 do in hand

4th I will to my son Alfred Bellingham
 a Negro Man named Abel, and a Negro boy
 named Harry, and the tract of land
 that I now live on, with all my
 singular things, and thereunto be
 - given

5th I will to my Daughter Margaret
Bellingham, a Negro Girl named
Harriet, and as much money as
 will buy her another dress of
 worth about two hundred dollars

6th And lastly of all I do hereby give
 and James Bellingham & Nathaniel
Bellingham, my whole and sole
 Executors of this my last will and
 testament, and do hereby revoke
 all other wills or parts by me heretofore
 made, and do declare, that to be my
 last will and testament, in witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal this 21st day of May 1803

The within Will was Proved in Court by Michael Dillingham one of the Executors & Survors to by John Clark a Subscribed witness thereto. Said Executor also Produced the Disposition of a Marcus Henry, who was also a subscribing testator to said Will, which was Obed to be Recorded, and thereupon said Will was admitted to record.

That first my Will and desire is that all my debt should be paid out of my Estate and that one tract of land lying on the Road of John Creek in Hardin County, should be sold for the best price that can be had. 2nd I Give and bequeath after my debt being paid, unto my dear and my dear beloved wife, all my worldly Estate during her Natural life or so long as she shall live, and after her death my Will and desire is that my said
