and State of Kentucky, being of sound mind and memory
do this 29th day of August 1807 make publish this my
last will and Testament in manner following, to wit, I give
and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth
King, during her widowhood, all my estate both real
and personal (for the support of her self & family,
who it is my desire) should be kept together, during
her said term of widowhood, and finally I give
bequeath to my two sons John & George the tract of

land or plantation whereon I now live, after they come
of age, provided my said wife Elizabeth shall
have married or deceased, but if she shall live &
continue single, she is to retain the same in full
and complete possession as stated in the first
article. And I will I give and bequeath to my
daughters Rebecca Jane, Margaret, Elizabeth, Rebecca
and Mary King, all my personal estate of every
kind to be equally divided amongst them after the
decease of my wife Elizabeth King or separation
of her widowhood, and fourth I do ordain
that my son John King & George King
whenever they shall come into complete possession
of the afore mentioned land agreeably to the
true intent and meaning of the first article of
this my last will and Testament, shall give to each
of my daughters a freehold, to wit, Rebecca Jane
Margaret Elizabeth, Rebecca & Mary or so many
of them as may be living at that time, on that
or more and paid to be estimated at one
thousand dollars. And I hereby make, and
ordain my worthy friend Thomas Garvin and
Joseph Franklin together with my wife Eliza-
beth King, Executors of this my last will and
Testaments. On witness whereof I the said
Robert King have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my the day and year first above
written
