set apart and have allotted, divided and set
apart to the said Lucy Long her dower in said
negroes as follows to wit: We do give
to said Lucy Long as her dower in said
negroes the following

10 negro boy named Minor

a negro boy named Jack

a negro Girl named Hannah

the 11th day of January 1812

In presence of god Amen, I James Dixon
of Christian County and Commissioner of the Court
being weak of body but in perfect memory and
Judgment and knowing that man is mortal
and must shortly return to the dust from whence
we came and this mortal must put in appearance
by one parents future steps a last will and
testament, do make and ordain this my last will and
testament, in manner and form following, that
is to say, first I recommend my soul to god who
gave it me, and my body to be buried in a decent
manner at the discretion of my executors —
Secondly I order that my youngest son William Dixon
a pay to my oldest child David thirty dollars
and my house bill — I order that my son
William pay to David Wood my son in law the
sum of thirty dollars Fourthly, I order that my
son William Dixon pay to James Brooks the
sum of Margaret Dixon my oldest daughter the sum
of thirty dollars and every other lawful bill
One dollar, fifthly I leave to my youngest son
William Dixon my land and plantation two
hundred and sixteen acres in the County of
fifthly I leave to my youngest daughter Mary
Wood and my personal property at my decease
I constitute and appoint my trust friend William Dixon
and David Wood my lawful executors to execute
this my last will & testament, making
