A Statement of George Waylen to Capt
Isaac Hargis on the day that the said
Hargis was about starting to the last money
on the 3rd of July last of the manner in
which he wished said Hargis to dispose of
his property of in said Waylen should
never return said Joseph Boyer to who
went with him would bring the land and
other property which he might purchase
at the onions and deliver to said Hargis
if the said Waylen should die. Secondly
said Hargis was inquired and instructed
to pay all said Waylen debts due by
note and also a certain open account
due to George Johnson out of his
Land. Thirdly said Hargis was instructed
that if his said waylen wife came to the
neighborhood & behaved herself well she
was to have Baby then living with
Mrs Bazel Brown - if said Hargis
desired said Waylen wife and improper
person to have the said child in
the Brown was instructed to keep

her, that baby should go to Henry Brown
man and if Mr Brown would
take Rebecca she was to go also to
Christian County otherwise to stay with
said Hargis if he would keep her
fourthly that if he Hargis chose the said
waylen should that said Hargis should
pay himself out of said Land for the
Land said Waylen purchased from said
Hargis but if it should not suit said
Hargis to take said he was take the
Land back further should said Hargis
take pay out of the Land the Land was
to be divided between William and the
Waylen sons of said George Waylen in
the following manner William & also to
Land two thirds and John one third of
said Land William part to be cut
of on the upper part of said Land and
John on the lower part fifthly that
