I Megimus Miller of the State of New York and County of Chautauque being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks being given unto god, Calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and Ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of I give & recommend my soul unto the hand of almighty god that gave it and my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian Burial at the discretion of my executors (nothing doubting) but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of god and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this life, I give ^{bequeath} ~~dispose~~ of the same in the following manner & form —

First I give and bequeath to Megimus Miller son of Samuel Miller and my gr & son and husband a piece of land on the water of the West fork of Red River, one Spring place Wicks Buyans Pearce and Stewart Home

Secondly I give my horse and waggin and two Cows & calves to be sold at public vendue and that the payment to be equally divided between Megimus Miller Andrew Miller my beloved son and Anna Boyd Easton Reigin & Martha Thomas my beloved
