Secondly it is my Will that after my Debts are paid that my beloved wife Belia Cain shall have the Balance of my Estate now in my Possession and all Debts or Money now due me and that she shall at her Discretion sell my Negro Men and Morians or any of my Property for the purpose of paying my Debts

Thirdly I do appoint my beloved wife Belia Cain my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and do request that the County Court of Christian County shall not require of my said beloved Wife Belia Cain any security for carrying the contents of this Will into Effect. I do hereby Revoke all other Wills or Wills by me heretofore made and do declare this to be my last Will and Testament
