 estate, and the Money arising, from said sale, together with the
 Money arising from the collection of my debts, and me, to be applied
 to the payment of all of my just debts -
 6th I leave and direct that my said Executors, sell likewise the
 tract of lands which I purchased of Walter Bennett, at Public
 Auction, and Credit of one, two, and three years in equal annual
 instalments, taking bonds, and sufficient security of the purchaser
 thereof, and also the residue of my lot in Northwester which
 I purchased of Henry Bunge to be sold on the said terms, and
 Conditions of the said tract of land, purchased of Bennett and
 the Money arising from the sale of said lot, to be put to
 out into a Note on Bank Note, in that way & manner thought
 most safe, and advantageous by my said Executors, hereafter named
 which Money is to be equally divided among, and paid all of my
 Children except my daughter Gwynn, as they severally arrive at
 lawfull age. 7th I Sheweth Constituted by

and State of Kentucky, being lawfully in body, but of sound and perfect
Mind and Memory Pleadeth before Almighty God for the same to make and
publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following
that is to say. first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
Hodge, during her Natural life the dwelling house and all other out-
buildings I now occupy, also one field of my cleared lands lying east of
which my Barn now stands and containing eight rods. Also the growing crops
of five acres, and near timber, at her own disposition

I do also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife My Hogs -
Two feather Beds and furniture and one Frank. Also one Pair Cows and calf
one Bay Mare and five of the first litters of my hogs. that were in the
Range when I now live. Also five Shotes or young Hogs. Out of the above
behave Mentions stables. Also one Iron post. Potatoes Dutch Beans ~~and~~ peas
dish and two pudd plates also one tin Cup and saucer. and six plates also
three heads of sheep. five Chick. Also of my present Property. Seven made tennys
Bands. Corn. and twelve Lushels Wheat. Also three sitting Chairs. and all the
sacredn leaves. I shold in possession also fourteen Good the whole to her
and her heirs forever - except the land and houses. above stated -
of the said

I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Hodges one Cow and lamb and one Kipper, also the sum of Twenty dollars. I do also give and bequeath to my eldest son Simeon Hodges one Grey Horse and rifle gun. I do also give and bequeath to my youngest son Samuel Hodges one feather bed and furniture and one young black Horse. Also I hereby give and bequeath to my two sons Joseph and Samuel all my Land estate, with the improvements thereto, belonging, equally to be divided between them, except that part already bequeathed to my said wife during her natural life that at my said wife's death the Land above bequeathed to her with the improvements thereto belonging be divided between my two sons Joseph and Samuel as above stated, and lastly as to all the Rest, Residue and Remainder of my present estate goods, Chattels of what kind soever, to be sold to highest bidder and after paying all my just debts the balance if any to be equally divided amongst my three children Simeon Samuel and Patsy. I am also desirous my trusty friends Asa and Josiah doo Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
