hundred and seventy five Acres of Timbered Land —
called Revels Old tract during his life & with a House
to be built and paid for out of the crops made before my
Decease to take place the said Land to come back at my
Death and be equally divided amongst all my Children
I Give unto my son Thomas One Negro woman Sary and
her Child One boy George and if that should not be an
equal portion of my Negroes for the Rest of my Children to
make it up if any One portion for him to pay it back to
the Estate with an equal part of Two ~~thousand~~ Nine

North and South side of Little River called the Muhlen-
burg Chimney to be laid off by Edward Bradshaw
and John at Locke including the place the place whereon
he now lives it is further my wish for the whole of the

to be supported from the Timber belonging to said tract.

Buckner likewise Allot four Negroes Amy & Child George Washington Valued at Five Hundred Dollars Phill four hundred Dollars Deephia three hundred Dollars Making the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars and leaving the other Lots both in Debt Fifty Dollars To George Buckner likewise Allot four Negroes Peter Valued at Six Hundred Dollars Hannah four Hundred Dollars William Two hundred Dollars Rich^d one Hundred & Fifty which makes the sum of thirteen hundred & Fifty Dollars & leaves this Lot as stated above in Debt to Mary A.
