my Executors may think best to appropriate thereto.

Item 2. I Will & bequeath unto my beloved Wife As the Buckner all
my Estate Real and personal that is not herein after otherwise
disposed of for and during her natural life.

Item 3. I Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Susan Buckner the fol-
lowing property To wit Robbin, black Billy, Biverty, Dolly and
all Dollys children that she has now or may here after have
and her choice of a Negro girl under Eighteen years of age and
as this increases to her & her heirs forever. And further more
I Will and bequeath to my said Daughter Susan the farm & land
whereon I now reside & all the household & childrens furniture
Stock & farming utensils thereto belonging after the death of my
aforesaid Wife for & during her life & her heirs forever her Marriage or
death to be disposed of as the executor of my Estate.

Item 4. It is my Will & desire that after my death there shall be no
wood or timber sold destroyed or used off of my Land more
than is necessary for fuel & to support the farm but it is to be
understood that this is not to prohibit the action of the
farm by clearing.

Item 5. Whereas I have heretofore given to my Son James Buckner
and George Buckner and my Daughter Elizabeth Mabel Garnd
As the Jones Buckner & Mary Jones Campbells equally
a proportion of my Estate. It is my Will that they shall
have nothing more until after the death of my aforesaid Wife.

Item 6. At the Death of my aforesaid Wife I Will & bequeath the
whole of my Estate not herein before devised to my Daughter
Susan to be equally divided among all my children then living
& should any of them be dead leaving children such children
shall receive their parents proportion to be equally divided
among them. But the proportions which may fall to my
unfortunate sons George Richard & Lewis I leave in trust
to my Executors the proceeds of which my said Executors shall
think best for them. But it is to be clearly understood that within
two years of my death herein devised to my said sons George
Richard & Lewis nor the proceeds thereof shall be returned to
the estate.

But should my sons George Richard & Lewis or either or any
of them die leaving lawful issue then their Respective portions
devised in this Item shall be equally divided among their respec-
tive portions issue or should either of my said sons George
Richard or Lewis die without issue then in that
case it is my Will & desire that their portion or portions shall
be equally divided between their surviving brothers & sisters
or their children. And in making the final divi-
sion of my Estate between my children and Grand children
as directed in this Item - I wish all monies that I have
paid or may hereafter pay or that Henry Garnits Estate has
paid or may have to pay for my sons George & Lewis to be taken
into consideration & charged against each of them as a part of
their said Respective proportions - and with more certainty
to ascertain the amount of money paid or to be hereafter
paid by me for either of my said sons George or Lewis any
account left in my own hand writing or receipt found among
my papers or which may appear from the Records of the Court
of King & Queen County Virginia or the Superior Courts of
Chancery of Virginia shall be deemed good & sufficient
evidence to establish the same.

My reason for giving my Daughter Susan more than the rest
of my children is that she has taken so active a part in the affairs
of the family & has been so serviceable to the whole of us and will
probably never marry - and it will ^{enough to} assist any of my unfortunate
children or Grand children.

Item 7. I appoint my friends Elisha M Edwards & Wiley Campbell to divide
my Estate between my children & should any difference arise
among them about my Estate I wish these Gentlemen to decide
all dispute between them relative to the same & should they
disagree I wish them to choose a third Man to assist them
& the decision of a Majority of them shall be as binding as
the decision of the highest Tribunal in the State.

Item 8. I appoint my son James Buckner and my sons in Law
John Buckner & John Campbell my Executors to this my last
