 my Negro Slave named Sam. also all of the residue of my personal
 estate and the money arising from said sale together with
 monies arising from the collection of my debts and me to be applied
 to the payment of all of my just debts -
 6th I leave and direct that my said Executors sell to Mary the
 tract of land which I purchased of Walter Bennett at Public
 Auction and consist of one two and three years in equal annual
 instalments taking bond and sufficient security of the purchaser
 thereof and also the residue of my debt in respect to which
 I purchased of Henry Buggs to be sold on the said terms and
 conditions of the said tract of land purchased of Bennett and
 the money arising from the sale of said lot land to be put to
 interest a Vested in Bank Stock in that way & manner thought
 most safe and advantageous by my said Executors hereafter named
 which money is to be equally divided among and paid all of my
 children except my daughter Gwynn, as they severally arrive at
 lawful age.
 7th I hereby constitute and appoint my
 dear friends Lacy Fortnack executor and John Bryan executor
 of this my last will & testament hereby revoking
 and annulling all former wills & testaments by me made.

 and State of Kentucky being sick in body but of sound and perfect
 mind and memory do hereby bequeath to my said wife all of my
 publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following
 that is to say. 1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
 Hinkins during her natural life the dwelling house and all other out-
 houses I now occupy also the fields of my cleared lands lying east of
 where my Barn now stands and containing eight acres also the proceeds
 of five acres and railtimber at her own disposition.

I do also give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Hinkins
 two feather beds and furniture and one Frank also one Bed Case and
 one Bay Man and five of the first Chairs of my house that were in the
 house when I was born. Also five Shells or young Hogs out of the above
 named Muttons stock also one Iron Pot. Potrack Dutch Oven ~~one~~ ^{two} plates
 dish and two pew plates also one set cups and saucers and six plates also
 three head of sheep first choice also of my present crop of corn made twenty
 Bands Corn and twelve bushels wheat also three sitting Chairs and all the
 second hand I hold in possession also fourteen Gals the whole to her
 and her heirs forever except the land and houses above stated -

I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Hinkins
 one Cow and lamb and one Huffer also the sum of Twenty dollars -
 I do also give and bequeath to my eldest son Jesse Hinkins one Gray
 Horse and eight gals I do also give and bequeath to my youngest
 son Samuel Hinkins one feather bed and furniture and one young
 black Horse also I hereby give and bequeath to my two sons Joseph
 and Samuel all my lands estate lands the improvements thereto
 belonging equally to be divided between them except that part already
 bequeathed to my said wife during her natural life that at my
 said wife's death the land above bequeathed to her with the improve-
 ments belonging be divided between my two sons Jesse and Samuel
 as above stated and lastly as to all the rest residue and remainder
 of my personal estate goods Chattels of what kind soever to be sold
 to highest bidder and after paying all my just debts the balance
 if any to be equally divided amongst my three children Jesse
 Samuel and Patsy. I do also appoint my truly friends & relatives
 Joseph Seate executor of this my last will and testament hereby
