I James Wilson of the County of Christian and State of Kentucky being very sick and weak in Body but of Perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is Appointed for either Once to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament That is to say first of all I wish my Just debts & funeral Expenses to be paid and for this purpose I wish my Executor hereafter to be appointed immediately after my Decease to sell all my Land I own in the State of Kentucky and also my Negro Man George & a mare that he Claims either at Public or private Sale as they may think most advisable and the proceeds together with the debts that are owing me when collected to be applied to the payment of my Just debts & Expenses if there should be a sufficiency If not then for my Executors to sell at Discretion such other of my Personal Estate as will be sufficient my Negroes excepted if there is enough I do a two Will and bequeath to my Beloved wife Rachel my Negro woman Hicks and her Increase if any during her life time & at her death to be sold & Equally divided among the Legates as they arrive of age I also will and it is my wish that my Beloved wife Rachel shall have my Negro Boy Silas during her widowhood but in case she should Marry then & in that case it is my wish that she should be sold & the proceeds Equally divided among the Legates if she should not Marry then for Silas to be sold after her Death in the same manner & form & for the same purpose that Hicks & her Increase is Directed to be sold It is also my wish that my Beloved ^{with Rachel} should have all the Ballance of all my Household Goods my Wagon Horses Cattle & Hogs & at her Death if there should be any thing left for it to be sold and divided between the Legates It is my wish and Desire that the Ballance of my Negroes should be divided among my children as follows to wit William Wilson my eldest Son to have \$200 which he has now in possession at \$200 my son James to have \$200 my son John to have \$200 my

son at \$200 my son John to have \$200 my Daughter Eliza to have \$200 it is further my wish & meaning that my son Young should have my \$100 to be paid him out of the crop now growing and for his Dear River over & above his part also my son Sam & John is to pay out of their parts \$200 each for their education in Education unto my four youngest children to wit Thomas, Elizabeth, Mary Ann, & Eliza as they come of age or marry. It is clearly my Object and my wish that my Estate should be Equally divided and for this purpose if Silas & Hicks & her Increase together with what Hicks shall be on hand & other Property at my Wife's Death shall not be sufficient to make up the Legacies of my four youngest children Equal with those that have been positioned off then and in that case they are to pay to the youngest children as aforesaid such sums as will reduce their parts as nearly equal as possible If there should be more than a sufficiency to make their parts equal then the surplus to be divided so as to make it equal It is my will and wish that my Negro Man Sam should be set free after my Death on his paying \$100 to my Executors in twelve months from my Decease to aid them in the payment of my Debts I do hereby appoint my Beloved son James Wilson & my nephew William Wilson & Matthew Wilson my Executors to this my last will & Testament disavowing & revoking any other will or wills but this my last Will & Testament It is further my wish that if my Executors can exchange my Negro Man George as is expected & his Mare to go with him him for some other Negro Man then & in that case he is not to be sold the Negro so got is to go to my wife Rachel during her widowhood to help raise my family & at her Marriage or Death as the case may be then to be sold & the proceeds equally divided between the Legates as before it is my further wish that if there should be any thing left after my Debts are paid sufficient it is my wish that it should be laid out in the purchase of a small tract of Land in the purchase where it is my wish they should remove for the purpose of a home for my wife & family during her life time & Descend to my son James as other Real Estate at her Death in the time whereof hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 7th day of August 1820—
