 that my Negro Boy Henry who now in the Possession of
 my Father Ezekiel Harrison in the State of Kentucky
 shall be sold into Good hands until he shall arrive
 at the age of twenty one years agreeable to a Bill of Sale
 now in my Possession And then I Will him his freedom
 and I Will my Negro Man Gerson his freedom as soon
 as he shall pay into the hands of my Executors the sum
 of Two Hundred Dollars & I Will my Negro Man -
 Tom Lilly his freedom as he was placed in my hands for that
 purpose by & I Will his former owner & I do hereby authorized
 and empower my Executors to convey in fee simple to the
 purchaser or purchasers all such Lands or other Real Estate
 as they may sell under this Will as well as to make Titles
 to such as to make Title to such as I have sold and not
 yet conveyed Lands or Lots & I Will I Will whatsoever
 Residue of my Estate of whatsoever kind it may be either
 Real or personal here or Else where after all my Just debts
 & funeral Expenses are discharged to Catherine Harrison
 Daughter of my Uncle Reuben Harrison of Harrisonburgh
 to her and her heirs and assigns forever And after my debts
