I Thomas Brown of Christian
 County and state Kentucky, being weak of body but strong of
 mind, and coming to mind the certainty of death and the
 uncertainty of the time it may happen - do by these presents
 make and confirm this my last will and testament, that is to
 say, I therefore give my soul to God who gave it and my body
 to the dust to be buried at the discretion of my Executors, and as
 to the worldly goods which it has pleased God to bestow on me I
 give and bequeath as follow. First, I have heretofore
 given to my daughter Anna Red of Christian County and state of
 Kentucky, a negro man named Barrett and many stock
 and other property which I now give and bequeath to her and
 her heirs forever. Next, I have heretofore given to my son James
Brown of Calverly County and state of Virginia a negro man
 named Ragel & a saddle horse which I now give and bequeath
 to him this heirs forever, and I do hereby give and bequeath
 to him and his heirs forever one hundred dollars to be paid
 as hereafter directed. Third, I have heretofore given my son
John Brown of Calverly County Virginia and negro
 boy named Free and one negro hire named Mariah
 which with their increase I give and bequeath to him and
 his heirs forever. Fourth, I have heretofore given to my daughter
Married Brown of Calverly County Kentucky, a negro woman
 named Ann Wright Red & one negro boy named Shawn
 which with their future increase I now give and bequeath
 to her and her heirs forever. Fifth. It is my will and desire
 that as much of my real or personal estate as my he heirs or
 as may be necessary for them, shall be sold and the proceeds

70. balance of my property, Real (negroes, stock of every kind, horses, household and kitchen furniture with my tract of land on which I now reside, &c) my will and desire that the whole be left in the hands and at the disposal of my beloved wife Catharine Brown during her natural life, and at her death to be equally divided amongst my four sons, Thomas, James, Edward, and William Brown, or the survivors of the four last-mentioned sons, and it is my will and desire that if either of my last-mentioned four sons Thomas, James, Edward and William should die without lawfully issue or before they come of age that the residue of my property after paying my debts as aforesaid that may remain in the hands of my wife - shall be equally divided amongst the survivors of my said four last-mentioned sons with the increase and profits of the said property forever to the said survivors and their heirs forever. And I do hereby appoint my wife Cath a true Brown Executor of my son Thomas Brown Executor to this my last will and testament - Heads, revoking all former and other wills made by me. - I do hereby pronounced this my last will and testament.
