 perfect in mind and memory do make & publish this my last
 Will and Testament in the manner and form as follows Viz
 I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sally Stevenson the bed
 and furniture which she had when we were married and
 choice of my Horses Two cows and calves also her third part
 of the house hold & Kitchen furniture also a Negro Woman
 named Malinda and a Negro Boy named Nelson I do
 bequeath and leave with my Daughter Rebecca to
 Stevenson one Negro Girl named Lydia one bond slave
 called Jant saddle & bridle also upper and under beds
 furnished with good clothing of good quality suitable for winter
 and summer also Two cows & calves and a common set of
 Hives & forks also a set of spurn plates &c a Ware I also
 give and bequeath unto my son James McInneson one
 Miles Stevenson the land whereon I now live and the Slaggon
 is to be for the use of the plantation until Miles becomes of age
 then it and the land is to be divided between them Two Miles and
 McInneson to have one Negro Boy named Cyrus and some
 Horse called Tom with a common saddle and bridle also
 one fether bed and furniture of a common quality Miles to
 have a Negro named Absa and one some Horse called
 Ferguson both one common saddle & bridle also one fether
 bed and furniture of common quality I also give and bequeath
 unto my Daughter Mary Stevenson one Negro Boy named
 Anderson and one upper and under beds with furnished
 clothing for summer and winter and one Negro Man called
 and saddle & bridle of common quality Two cows & calves
 one set of Hives & forks spurn plates &c a Ware of common
 quality I also give and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane
 & Miles Stevenson one Negro Boy named Andy and one
 of every part of property as the two preceding listers I do
 give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary McInneson
