 be then living she should not so long to be equally divided between
 my wife Sarah & my son Nathaniel & Ewing & until my daughter
 arrives to twenty and, I allow my wife Sarah to be hired out
 except when the family may want her at home, & the money
 be put to the use of the family. I also allow my daughter Rachel
 McEwing one of the best, & the best for it out of the above named
 bed & cloth, also one third of all the household & kitchen furniture
 as soon as she may need it. I further allow my daughter Rachel
 McEwing one horse, bird & brood, when she arrives to the age
 of twenty and, I give & bequeath to my son Nathaniel McEwing
 one negro boy named Milton when he shall arrive to the age of twenty
 & until that time come, I will that he be to remain in the family, for
 use thereof, during the widowhood of my wife, & when she should
 need again I give Milton to be hired out for the use of my wife
 & Ewing. I will that such of the farming utensils as may
 be wanted necessary for the use of the family remain in it, during
 the widowhood of my wife, & when she should want them to
 accord to my son Nathaniel McEwing

I will that the whole of my stock of cattle & sheep, as soon as
