

125) of my body as my wife (may) think proper to order for the use of her
and the family. And as many of my sheep as my wife may wish for
family use, which she is to have her to dispose of, she may think proper.
Secondly I give and devise unto my wife Polly, as my Woman
named Cherry during her life time; And that after her death she &
hers and her issue should she hereafter have any to go equally to my
two children. I also give unto her all my household and kitchen
furniture, I also wish my wife to have the one third of my land
during her life time, then my land to go equally to my two children.
I also wish my wife to have a third part of all my personal
Estate after my just debts are paid.

Thirdly, I give unto my daughter Rachel, (born a negro boy
named King. Fourthly, I give unto my daughter Elizabeth,
a negro boy of the name of Mathias. And it is my will that if either
of the foregoing boys die before my daughter becomes of legal age in my
Will that such loss should be made up to the end, thereof, out of
the other part of my Estate. It is also my will that they receive
good education and be furnished with decent apparel, until their
Education ends these being barons. It is my will, that a negro woman
by the name of Kate be sold. It is also my will, that should I die
be instituted for the said slave to live on. I wish my wife to defend as
far as my executors may stand prudent.

It is also my desire, that my executors make such provision for my mother as I may become to do from a written agreement existing between us. I now lastly do constitute and appoint my friends Thomas, Archibald and Polly my wife as Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
