Mary Betty & Henry & Gray Horse saddles and Breeches the household and kitchen furniture which came by her to shall be delivered up to her after my death by my executors herein after named to be held and owned again by her forever. And that all my own property shall be first subject to the payment of all my just debts and after the payment thereof the balance of my property shall be divided as follows one half to my wife Maria

Foster and the other half divided among my brethren equally except my share and one half of the said which I give and bequeath as a legacy to my Brother Stephen Foster 3rd It is my Will and desire that all my wearing Apparel shall be such my younger Brothers viz. John is my wife and lastly that Doctor Williams to be a guardian of John & Henry & John Buckner shall be and I do hereby appoint them my executors with full Authority to carry out this my last Will and Testament into full effect.
