1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid.
2nd It is my will that my Executors do sell either at public or private sale at their own discretion any tract or tracts of land or town lots with the improvements thereon for the purpose of paying my debts, leaving my negroes, household furniture and farming utensils for the use of my family; and after all my just debts are paid and the expenses of finishing my house and the Education of my two youngest daughters and my son Henry Barry is paid for. It is my will that my beloved wife Rosa shall have and thrive of my whole Estate, and the balance of my Estate to be equally divided among my children.

3rd and lastly of all I do appoint my wife Rosa my son Valentine D Barry and John Clark my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills or wills by me heretofore made and do proclaim this to be my last will and testament.

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In the name of God Amen. I John Brown dec. of the County of Christian State of Kentucky being weak and sound of body but sound of mind & memory do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner and form following (To wit) first my will & desire is that my son-in-law James Blasingame have one hundred acres of the land whereon I now live to be taken from whichever end of the survey the 1st Blasingame shall choose. It is my will and desire that the 1st Blasingame shall from paper my account take charge of my wife Patsy Brown that he take and after support her as long as she lives. The other hundred acres of the land I leave to my son William Brown & Patsy Brown the daughter of my daughter Patsy Brown to be equally divided between them. It is my will and desire that the heirs of the horse creatures be sold & that my wife Patsy Brown have the money that they are sold for, to support upon as long as she lives and that the money if there be any left be equally divided among my children. It is my desire that my wife Patsy have one of the horse creatures, which ever she chooses (there is five head of horse creatures) the rest to be sold as aforesaid. The hogs and calves with my wife Patsy to have the use of as long as she lives & that my son in law James Blasingame have them to his own use.

The household furniture I leave to my wife Patsy to dispose of among the children as she shall think proper, according to her own discretion. I may think proper during her life. I leave to my children Peggy, Harriet, Jeremiah Brown, Polly, Mathias, Rachel, Herring, William Brown, John Brown, Patsy Clarke, Leonard Brown, Miley Blasingame the sum of five dollars each from the money that is now due to me at debt, if there be enough, if not, let them divide whatever is the amount equally among them.
