I, Alexander M. Garvey knowing that it is appointed all men shall die and being weak in body and it being uncertain how soon it may be my fate to make and declare this to be my last legal testament, I do give and bequeath to my loving wife Isabella M. Garvey my house and lot on which I now live as the Town of Hopkinsville and all the household and kitchen furniture and every thing appertaining and belonging thereto Also one cow and all the personal property and Negroes or Negro which may be coming from the Estate of John Moore deceased after the death of Jane Moore the widow, all which is to belong to my wife for and during the period of her natural life and after her death any of the said property above bequeathed to my wife is to belong to my son John William Alexander M. Garvey and if my wife should survive my son the said property to belong and be disposed of by her as she may think proper. And after my death my surviving partner and Brother John M. Garvey shall keep the goods in the Store which shall then be on hand for the period of Nine Months thereafter and pay and satisfy out of the proceeds of the same any debts which may be outstanding against me as they become due and payable the principal part of which are hereinafter enumerated and any debt which may be due and unpaid after that time shall be satisfied out of the goods remaining on hand at the expiration of Nine Months. And to be disposed of by my Executor hereinafter named as they may think best for the payment of my debts by me and at that period and all the outstanding debts due me at this time for goods sold hereafter shall be collected by my said Brother John and surviving partner as far as he may be able during the said period of Nine months from my death and applied to the payment of any said debts and what shall be unpaid at the expiration of that time shall be collected by my said Executor hereinafter named and applied to the payment of any of my said debts then due and unpaid giving my said surviving partner William John M. Garvey the right at the expiration of the said Nine months of the

then on hand at cost and charges by selling the same & of the same I shall pay my debts or Executor and after all my debts shall have been paid the balance of the proceeds of said goods and debts shall be paid over by my Executor to my wife Isabella M. Garvey 3rd The land lying in Todd County which came to me by my wife from her father John Moore and which shall be sold by my said Executor hereinafter named immediately after my death at Nine Months Credit or any manner they may think best and the proceeds of said sale to be applied to the payment of any of my debts then unpaid. The balance of any to be paid over to my wife.

If my surviving partner Brother John M. Garvey shall not wish to one half the profits of all goods sold and disposed of by him by way of retail during Nine Months from my death. The following are the principal debts due by me at this time viz 1821 to the Hopkinsville Branch Bank payable by Agreement by instalments of one hundred dollars of the debt every thirty days till to the Farmers Branch Bank payable as the Board may call according to the rules of the Institution. And to the firm of Wood & Pate payable on the 1st day of Sept 1821. Subject to a premium of Two per Cent if not paid in Cash or funds. And debts due from John M. Garvey my Brother and surviving partner to me up to this time shall not be collected of him but the same I make him a present of. I also leave him all my clearing Appraisement. I do Appoint my wife Isabella M. Garvey the Guardian of my son John William Alexander M. Garvey until he is of age of 21 years.

I do hereby Appoint David Pate & John W. Williams my lawful Executors to carry into effect all and every part of my foregoing will and testament and in either of them shall have and I do hereby best them with full power and authority to do and perform all and every power hereafter granted them. Given under my hand and seal this first day of July 1821.
