The name of John Jones, This is my last will and testament, first, I command my body to be buried in a decent manner, and my soul to God only good is, I now being in my perfect mind and senses, first I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Jones, the farm that I own live on while she remains my widow and if she marries the farm to be sold and the money to be put to interest until the youngest child is of age - there is a young horse and a bay two year old in the spring and a little bay mare to be sold - and the money to be sold out and the money to go to the use of the family while my wife remains a widow and if she dies the money then the money from that time to go to the use of the children and if my wife dies and no more children to remain.
