be first paid I give my daughter Milly Henson one
Yellow Mare Five Years Old one feather bed & furniture
I also give my Daughter Phoe Henson one sorrel horse with
two Years Old also one feather bed & furniture I also lend
to my beloved wife Dray Henson all the rest of my Estate
real & Personal during her widowhood I also give my Land
whereon I now live to my two sons John Henson and
Andrew Henson to be equally Divided between them, and
the rest of my Estate besides the Land to be equally divided
between Paddy Cornelius, Darcas Moore, Peggy Weaver, Milly
Henson, Hester Green and Phoe Henson my Daughters and
I also wish that Elizabeth Dory and Celia Cashie my Daughters
have Five Dollars a piece to be made out of my Estate and
lastly I appoint my wife Dray Henson my executrix and
Andrew Henson my Executor to this my last will and Testament
in Writing whereof I have set my hand and seal this fifteenth
Day of September Eighteen hundred and Nineteen
