I assign my soul to God and my body to interred in the ground I
was being in my perfect mind and senses And as to my Personal and real
Estate I do give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Johnson the whole
part of all the above named Estate to be disposed of as she may think fit
at her death likewise to Mary Child and Archabald the children of my
said wife with the exception of One dollar to each One of the said
legates and I have my own hands to be my seal and with my own
friend Archabald Burt this being now my last will and testament
signed sealed and delivered in the presence of the undersigned witnesses
day and date above written

Agreeably to an Order of the Christian County Court at Newburgh
 dated 1820 do lay off the River of Anne Martin Widow of Christopher
 Martin and the two undersigned met on the premises of said
 Estate on the 22nd day of July 1821. And after being duly sworn
 by John Good as acting Justice of the Peace, we proceeded to
 discharge the duties said Order means and laid off thirty acres of
 land agreeable to the Surveyors report as marked and bounded in
 the Annexed Plat N^o 1. which we refer to and make a part of this
 our report as the Meadows part of what is called the Rivers tract
 We also laid off four acres as the Wood lots part of fifteen acres
 that lies on the North side of Horse Creek known by the name
 of the Timber tract. And marked and bounded in Plat N^o 2 which
 we refer to and make a part of this our report the Commutators
 reports to us that the Moveable Estate said amounts to about
 seven hundred fifty dollars after paying all just debts
 of which we allow the Creditors to have. The negro property
 is similar of an age now in number to a number of children or
 daughters being only two Males and two female Children
 viz the Males Henry and Mariah the Children We therefore think
 it best for the Administration to hire the Males and the Children best
 suited it could be practised to make a decision and the Creditors to
 receive one third of the proceeds untill that time the above being
 all the Estate real & personal submitted to us by the Administrators
 These we close our report.
