In the name of God amen I Leonard Hays of the County of Christian & State of Kentucky being of sound & perfect mind & memory blessed be God do this Twenty seventh day of May One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eighteen make & publish this my last Will and Testament in the Manner & form following that is to say first I most Humbly bequeath my Soul to God my maker beseeching his most gracious acceptance of it through the all sufficient merits and mediation of my most compassionate redeemer Jesus Christ who gave himself to be an atonement for my sins and is able to save to the last all that come to him I give my body to the Earth from whence it was taken in full assurance of its resurrection from thence to the Last day as for my Burial I desire it may be decent without pomp or state at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named who I doubt not will manage it at request & with prudence As to my worldly Estate I will & positively Order that all my Just debts be paid also that my Beloved wife Rachel have the use and benefit of all my Estate During her Natural Life at her Death it is my Will & desire that the two Negroes David & China go free & also the Increase of China if any there be — and Moreover that the Balance of my Estate go to the support of the Gospel to be disposed of at the discretion of my Executors

I desire that John Graham & Peter Cartwright be the Executors of this my last Will & Testament
