In the name of God Amen, I John Purdy Sheriff of the County of Christian and State of Kentucky being of perfect mind and memory (Thanks be to God) calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and enact this to be my last will and testament, that is to say principles, and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and bequeath of the same in the following manner and form.

First I leave unto my loving wife Mrs. Purdy, a parcel and negro, among

74. **Robert Purdy, and Richard Davis Pradley**, the estate before mentioned at present of the following property (to wit) a tract of five hundred and fifty acres of land situate in the County of Christian, four head of horses, eight head of cattle, twenty one head of pigs and one my hundred and sixteen hundred and sixteen Acres of land, and at the death of my wife the before mentioned property with the increase to be equally divided between my two said sons **Robert Purdy and Richard Davis Pradley**, excepting one head of the same of eight months I give to my son **Ezekiel Purdy**, and if my two said sons shall die under age or without issue, then and in that case the estate above mentioned to be divided between my four daughters **Abigail Bryan, Elizabeth Nelson, Malinda Thompson, Lucy Rowland and Cyrene Parrott** in the following manner, to wit, and third of the above estate to **Cyrene Parrott** and two thirds to be equally divided amongst my said four daughters, and in case that one of my said sons should die under age or without issue, then the surviving one to inherit the moiety that the deceased (brother) was entitled to.

And I do appoint my wife **Lucy Pradley**, my Executors, and **Mr. Pradley and Jacobiah McLeod**, my Executors to this my last will, testament and I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and annul all and every other former testament, will, legacy, bequest and Executors by me in anywise before named, made and bequeathed, saving my heirs, assigns and no other to be my last will and testament.
