I Michael Northington of the State of Kentucky and County of Christian being Low and weak in Body but of a Sound Mind and Memory (Thanks be to God) do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in the following Manner — First I Give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Temperance One Negro Man named Ephraim Also One hundred Acres of Land for and during her Natural Life it being the Land I purchased of my Uncle William Northington including the Houses where I now dwell also I Give to my said Wife One Roan Horse I also devise my Executors herein Named may lay off and apportion as much of my Stock and provisions as they may deem and think sufficient for the Support of my said Wife and Children for one Year also as many of my Working Tools as they my Executors my think proper for — forming I also Give to my said Wife One Feather Bed and Furniture I also Give all my Household and Kitchen Furniture to my Wife and Children to be kept for their use except such part as hereafter I may Mention — I Give my Daughter Sarah One Negro man named Frank which said Negro Frank I devise my Executors may Hire for the Term of Three Years and the Money that said Frank is hired for to be applied to the Support of all my Children I also Give my to my said Daughter Sarah One Bay Horse and One Feather Bed and Furniture I Give to my Daughter Martha One Negro Girl named Fanny and One Feather Bed and Furniture I Give to my Daughter Eliza Ann One Negro Girl named Temperance and One Feather Bed and Furniture I Give to my Daughter Rebecca Money One Negro Boy named Lewis and One Feather Bed and Furniture I Give to my son Samuel Northington and to his heirs and assigns forever and to my son Felix Northington and to his heirs and assigns forever Two Hundred Acres of Land to be equally divided between them and also I Give One hundred Acres of Land to be equally divided between my two Daughters after the Death of my Wife Temperance which said hundred Acres have been given to my said Wife for and during her Natural Life
