I Philip Reed of Christian County do hereby make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament revoking all others in the Manner following
 1st I desire my Executors hereafter named to pay all of my just debts as soon as possible
 2nd I leave to my loving Wife Lucy B Reed so long as she remains my Widow the hole of my Estate except such as I hereafter dispose of Involving on her to finish the Education of my Children in the Manner began in case she should Marry
 It is my Will that she shall be third
 3rd I give unto my my Children Frances Reed, Lucy, William Mandabut and Richard Reed as they becomes of age or Marry One Negro Girl or Boy between the age of Twenty and Twenty Five years old and the same to be divided

to them and their heirs forever
 It is my Will and desire that my Executors shall lay out the Money due me out in Land to the best Advantage for the benefit of my Estate supposing it to be Three thousand Dollars the land purchased under this clause shall be equally divided among my Children as the Best of my Lands

5th I give unto my Son Edgar Reed my two Negro boys Henry and William horse Saddle and Bridle and all furniture when he becomes of age or Marries to him and his heirs forever

6th At the Death of my lovely Wife Lucy B Reed all of the Negroes that I have not already disposed of shall be divided in five equal parts that one part to Frances Reed Lucy, William Mandabut and Richard Reed to them and their heirs forever

7th My proportion of the Land purchased of Thom Alshury in Christian County and the Lands that may or shall be purchased by my Executors shall be divided into six equal parts One to Frances Reed Lucy, William Mandabut Richard and Edgar Reed to them and their heirs forever

8th It is my Will that my Executors shall give unto my Man Harry yearly so long as he conducts himself with propriety to his Mistress twelve Dollars during his life And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother William Reed Executor and my lovely Wife Lucy B Reed Executrix of this my last Will and Testament for lifetime whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the Twelfth day of August in the Year One thousand Eight hundred and Nineteen
