In the first place I recommend my land to be sold and given to the poor of my County and to the poor of the State.

92. I have also written to my wife, Jane, to have a lot of land, known by the name of Jones, located between my land and the land of John S. Jones & daughter & my son Benjamin in Row more old V. my note. I have also bequeathed to my daughter Sarah one bed & furniture. I have also bequeathed all of my property, that is the property, that will not be of use in the family, shall be disposed to the highest bidder & the proceeds to be kept in a bank to be equally divided amongst the widow & orphan at the time of removal or death of my family. I have also bequeathed that my land shall be disposed of in the same way as the property in Row more. I bequeathed that all my property, that is left for the use of my family when said family is either deceased or removed shall be disposed to sale to the highest bidder & the proceeds to be kept in a bank to be equally divided when the said property is disposed of. I will that each legatee shall have his or her portion of it when he is or she becomes of age or when married.

I do nominate & appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth my Executor and my much respected friend John Boyd my Executor to take my last will & testament.

Whereas I have a suit pending in the Court of equity wherein I am complainant & James Boyce is defendant, when said suit is decided if against me I will that all the costs shall be paid out of my estate but if I obtain said suit I will that the proceeds shall be equally divided between my widow & orphan, I will that all my just debts shall be discharged with the proceeds of my estate.

 desire that the above named cows & calves & horses be equally
 divided between my four daughters. I do will & bequeath to my wife
 all my farming tools of every kind and at her death it is my will
 desire that the farming tools be equally divided between my four
 daughters. I do will & bequeath all the rest of my personal prop-
 erty (except my stock of hogs & one steer) to my four daughters Sarah
 Harrison, Betty Oyer, Liddy Read & Mary Read, to be equally divided
 between them after my death. I do will & bequeath that my
 stock of hogs remain on the farm for the use of the family.
