 Life and after her Death it is my Will and desire that all
 the above Property be sold to my Wife be sold to the highest
 Bidder for ready Money and the Money arising from the
 Sale to be equally divided between my six Children
 now living to wit Mildred, Howard, Edward, Leavelle, Lewis
 Leavelle, Benjamin, Leavelle, Elizabeth, F. Ford and Fanny Leavelle
 or their Heirs = and all the balance of my Property not above
 Willed it is my Will and desire that after my Death be sold
 at Public Sale to the highest bidder for cash & Out of the
 Money arising from such Sale it is my Will & desire that
 my Executors hereafter to be named - Shall pay to the four
 Children of my Deceased Daughter Mary Sims One
 hundred Dollars Each as they become of Lawful Age -
 or Mary = & the Balance of the Money to be Equally
 divided between my six Children now living Except
 my son Benjamin Leavelle & he is to deduct out of his proportion
 of Money the Valuation of One Hundred Acres of Land which
 I have Deeded to him Two hundred Acres of Land which
 to be Valued as in its Natural State by three Disinterested
 Men = And it is my Will & desire that my two Sons Lewis
 Leavelle & Benjamin Leavelle shall act as my Executors
 after my Death & that they shall be bound to settle with
 my Legacies in Twelve Months from the day of Sale of
 all my Property & not sooner nor shall they be bound to
 pay any Interest until after that time In Testimony
