

In the name of God Amen. I Thomas Green of said County and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory do make and Ordain this as my last will and testament: 1st It is my last will and desire that all my just debts be paid, 2nd It is my request and desire and last request that my said son Edward Green hereinafter named be furnished my son Edward Green - ample and sufficient means of support maintenance & clothing until he shall have completed such course of education & study and attainment of such profession as my nephew John Lee Green of Virginia may prescribe for him.

3rd I give and bequeath to my said son Edward & Green his heirs and assigns forever one equal sixth part of my Estate real personal and mixed to be held and put into his possession when he shall attain the age of twenty years if he shall have completed his education. And further I give and bequeath to him three hundred dollars in Cash and a horse saddle and bridle to be paid and delivered to him on the completion of his education. 4th I give and bequeath to my wife Lucy Green his heirs and assigns forever all the residue of my Estate real personal and mixed however to the payment of my debts and the support maintenance & clothing of my son Edward and the amount of three hundred dollars these Saddle & bridle as above mentioned. 5th In case my wife shall at any time think proper to dispose of the said hereby devised to her I do give her power to dispose of the Estate bequeathed to my son Edward also, and in that case she shall be bound to transfer one sixth portion of the entire value of my Estate at the time of such sale thereof.

6th I appoint my wife Lucy Green sole executrix of this my last will and testament and do expressly require and direct that she shall not be bound to give or receive Bond or security on qualifying as such executrix, that it be my request for her to make no return any inventory or appraisement of my Estate or any part thereof.

In the name of God Amen I Aaron Lewis of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows: 1st That all my just debts be paid the balance of my Estate both real and personal I give and bequeath to my three single daughters, namely Margaret, Elizabeth and Porthanna and my little grand daughter Lucy Ann Harris to be divided or proportioned as follows: That is to my daughter Margaret Lewis one third to my daughter Elizabeth Harris one third to my daughter Porthanna Lewis one third to my grand daughter Lucy Ann Harris one half share.

We the undersigned witnesses being present on the 26th of September 1824 when the above was read, and heard the said Aaron Lewis say that this was the way he intended to leave the whole of his Estate this 26th of September 1824.
