And this (man) of God, Amos, I Thomas Martin of the County of Christian and state of Kentucky being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament: that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that good is and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but of the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bestow upon me in this life I give devise and bequeath of the same in the following manner and form, first I give and bequeath to Isaac and Samuel D. Martin

I bequeath them, their mother Rachel Martin to have her maintenance on the place during her life and widowhood, also I give to wife Rachel Martin one bed and furniture and two cows and calves and one sorded horse also I give to Samuel D. Martin one horse and saddle also I give to my son Thomas Martin, one rifle gun one cow and one horse and pig, to Abner Martin I give my grey mare and bed or the value of it in money to my daughter Dorothea Martin I give one bed and furniture, also I leave to my wife Rachel and the rest of my property together my household goods and kitchen furniture, after paying to certain calls to Henry Moore. I own Martin my son also John Martin and William Gray also Joseph Martin to the above named persons I leave one dollar each, also I leave my wife Rachel and Joseph Martin executors to this my last will and testament.
