 one Negro girl named Nellie and one Bay Mare my feather
 bed and furniture and I give to her

178 one Bay Mare for school fees to settle all my just debts and
 all of my remaining property to be sold for the benefit of my heirs
 except one Negro Girl named Patience and also to be left in
 the care of my wife a father until she becomes to be twelve years
 of age and then to be bound out for the life and benefit of my heirs on
 this I leave my father & brother John Meacham my administrator
 to my estate I acknowledge this to be my last will & Testament given
 this eleventh day of July 1818. Signed in the presence of

 in the following manner that is to say I give & bequeath to my daughter
 Margaret one black mare one cow & calf and two feather beds also
 to my son Daniel I give a Negro Liberman named Betty also
 all the rest of my household furniture and Plantation utensils and
 feather bed & also all the rest of my movable property and my son
 Daniel is to pay all my just debts & funeral Charges I do hereby
 utterly disallow revoke disannul all & every will & estate made
 before by me in Writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal
 this 10th August 1818.
