In the Name of God Amen I William Redding of the County of Christian and State of Kentucky Being, Sane and of sound Body but of perfect mind & Memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the Mortality of the Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to Die, do make & Ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give & Recommend my Soul unto the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty power of God; and as touching such worldly Estate whereunto it has pleased God to Bless me with in this Life, I Give Devise Bequeath of the same in the Manner and form following First of all I give and bequeath unto my Beloved Wife Martha Redding the whole of my Estate both real and personal after the payment of all my Just Debts for and during her natural Life and after her Death I Will and Bequeath the whole of my Estate both Real & personal as follows First I give & Bequeath unto Lewis Murdock who married my half sister one cow off calf, and unto Willis Murdock his son one Feather Bed & furniture I also Will & Bequeath unto William Tadder my full brother in Law & unto his four Children Elizabeth, William, Nancy and Benjamin one Hundred Cents each, I also Give & Bequeath unto Timothy Awsey Polly Awsey, Layban Awsey, James Awsey, and Robert Awsey One of my half Sister's children one Hundred Cents each to be paid by my Executors after my Decese when applied for, It is my Will and pleasure that at the Death of my Beloved Wife Martha Redding, that my Negro Lewis Edmond Ama, and Alice, Benj. and for ever thereafter enjoy their Freedom with their increase if they should have any and it is my further my Will that they take charge of my Negro Boys Daniel, Elias and baul and Raise them untill they arrived at the age of Twenty One Years of age and that they then be free and forever after enjoy their Freedom, But in case the said Lewis Edmond, Ama & Alice nor either of them should not live untill they arrived at the age of Twenty One that it is my Will that my Executors take them up and then out untill they arrived at the age of Twenty One I do further give and Bequeath unto Lewis Edmond Ama & Alice twenty five Acres of Land

posed & enjoyed immediately after the death of my beloved wife
 Martha Redding (deceased) as Joint Tenants in Fee Simple forever
 I also will and Bequeath unto the said Lewis, Edmond, Anna
 & Alice all my looking Tools, It is further my wish and desire
 that the Balance of my personal Estate except One Horse called
 Bonaparte, which I have given to my Negro Man Edmond by
 now in his possession) Be distributed as follows One half
 thereof to be equally divided Between Robert Redding Lewis
 Murdock Daniel Haile Senr & Deedbury bloodless, the
 other half of my Personal Estate I will by Bequeath unto my
 Negroes Lewis, Edmond, Anna & Alice to be equally divided
 Between them and in case the Distributees should not
 agree in the Division thereof it is my wish that my Executors
 sell the same & divide the Money Equally Between them
 Lastly I do hereby appoint Daniel Haile Senr. and Abram
 Robinson my Executors to this my last Will & Testament
 in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 affixed my Seal this 30th day of June 1818
