Clark deceased One Negro woman named Abby & her
present increase & all her Increase forever —
5thly I Will unto John P. Fenley Husband to the above
named Healer Fenley a Negro Boy named Ned after
the Death of my wife —
6thly I Will unto my Daughter Susannah Wheeler
a Negro woman named Pats her present Increase
and all her Increase forever —
7thly I Will to my Daughter Mary Ann Whitson
a Negro woman named Lob her present Increase and
all her Increase forever —
8thly I will unto my Daughter Sarah Davis
a woman named same with her present Increase
and all her Increase forever —
