I do leave my funeral matters above named here and for my children Abraham and Jane to be free at my death. I do bequeath all the rest of my estate (of what nature or kind ever it may be not herein before particularly disposed of) to be equally divided between my two daughters Rachael, the wife of Sept Harrison and Hannah, the wife of William Priddy. I do hereby constitute, appoint my son-in-law Sept Harrison and William Priddy executors of my last will and Testament, each, executing all other or former wills or Testaments by me heretofore made.

In writing whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and signed my will this tenth day of August one thousand eight hundred and forty two signed, sealed, published as the last will of the above named Mary Harrison in the presence of us.
