And that the said Payer McNeill as one of the administrators in his life time disbursed three thousand two hundred & ninety one dollars eighty five cents, leaving a balance of what came to the hands of said Payer, and what he disbursed of thirty two dollars seventy eight cents, agt said Payer McNeill and that One thousand two hundred & ten dollars 14 cts of the goods, chattels & credits of Henry McNeill and Dorothy McNeill dec'd had come to the hands of Malcolm McNeill; And that the said Malcolm McNeill Administrator has disbursed to the Creditors & Legates of said Henry & Dorothy \$623.39 Cents, And hereunto returned 216.25 Cents of notes due the estate of said decedent, and allowing the said Malcolm his part as heir & legatee of the said Henry & Dorothy, of what has come to his hands which part is coming to him is \$147.62, making in all what the said Malcolm so disbursed & returned notes & his part of what comes to his hands as aforesaid three & a balance of the said Malcolm McNeill Administrator is aforesaid the sum of \$122.33 Cents all which are report to said Court June under our hands September 13th 1825.
