

In the name of God Amen. I Adam Guthery of the State of Kentucky and County of Cumberland being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say Principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of

almighty God that give and my body I command to be buried with a decent Christian  
 burial at the direction of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general  
 Resurrection I shall receive the same I again by the mighty power  
 of God and as touching such worldly Estate whereunto it has pleased  
 God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of in the following manner  
 and form to wit, I first give to my son James Guthery my gray mare that he  
 has now in his possession and to George Guthery one cow and to Thomas Guthery  
 a plantation on which he now lives, and to Sally and Nancy Guthery the Plantation  
 on which I now live also a plantation in east Tennessee on French broad  
 river on which I formerly lived also the balance of my stock, farming utensils and  
 household furniture to be equally divided between S. Sally and Nancy and if  
 any thing can be recovered from obligation I now hold on John Anderson of  
 forty pounds it is to be equally divided among all my children I also  
 appoint Thomas Guthery and George C. Craft the executors of this my last  
 will and testament and I do hereby utterly Disallow revoke and annul  
 all other testament wills Legacies by me in anywise before made. Willing ratifying  
 and confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament  
 In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup> day of May  
 in the year of our Lord 1825
