Milley & Lindy, and I give and bequeath to my Brother Daniel Baker, Molly and Jacob and in case that Fanny has no other Child or Children I give and bequeath Lindy to my five brothers before mentioned but in case she has a Child or Children I give and bequeath to my sister Marjaret & I give and bequeath to my sister Susanah & Francis Baker and dolls. to her and her heirs forever Lindy and her increase. I do hereby nominate, and do appoint my Father James Baker Executor of his my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal this 17th day of November 1829, acknowledged & subscribed in the presence of us

Twelfth; I give and bequeath unto my two sons Lewis & Joseph all and singularly the money bonds and property of every description whatever, after the foregoing bequests are completed and paid; to be equally divided between them - - - And Lastly. We utter publicly declare and seal this is my last will and Testament hereby disannulling and revoking all former wills by me made, and do also hereby constitute nominate and appoint my son Lewis Ellison my only executor in this said last will and Testament. Codicil to the last will and Testament of Amos Ellison

First; Amos Ellison give and bequeath to my son Joseph one hundred and fifty dollars to be paid to him by my Executor so soon as the amount can be raised from the sale of my estate or otherwise collected
 Second; I hereby revoke the bequest of one hundred fifty dollars by me made to my son John Ellison in my original will and in lieu thereof give unto him fifty dollars only and if he is not living at my death or fails to apply for the same in two years to my Executor the same is to be equally divided among my Children then living
 Third; I hereby revoke the 6th Bequest in my Original will of fifty dollars by me made to my son Thomas so far as to authorize my Executor in case the said Thomas die before I do. to divide the said fifty dollars equally among my Children
 Fourth; I revoke the seventh Bequest in my will by me made in giving to my son James Ellison one hundred and fifty dollars, and in lieu thereof give said James one hundred dollars to be paid as pointed out in said 7th devise - Fifth; I hereby revoke the 12th Bequest in my original will by me made, giving to my two sons Lewis & Joseph all the money Bonds & property of every kind after paying off all bequests by me made in said will on this supplement, and in lieu thereof give to whole of said money Bonds and property in that devise to wit, 12th Bequest to my son Lewis alone - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 30th day of July 1828
