

And for thorough it is my Will & desire & I think it practicable in the sale of the residue of the lands & the personal property to make the portions of the Children equal without settling selling any of the Slaves. Which can be valued and taken by the Children at their valuation in case any two or more of the Children should make choice of the same slave that they the Contending parties decide the same by balloting for it. I have in this short instrument divided out amongst my Children all of my property in such manner as I have conceived to be just & right according to their various Circumstances & situations - and sincerely hope and desire that they may receive the same according to my Will & live in peace and harmony one with another - and do hereby and lastly nominate and appoint my sons John M. Baker and Aljerson S. Baker Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other and former Wills by me made - As Witness my hand and seal this 26th day of December 1836.

Scott and Daniel Saylor formerly lived my wife and my daughter Elizabeth Carter are to have an equal interest with said Polly in the aforesaid land for their mutual benefit and support so long during the natural life of my wife & after her death said Elizabeth to have a mutual interest and possession with said Polly Carter in said land during the natural life of my daughter to wit Polly & Elizabeth & after their death the land & the proceeds arising from the sale thereof to be equally divided among my legal heirs - 3rd My Granddaughter to be Susan Carter is to have an equal Benefit and possession in the land with my daughter and wife during their natural lives or so long as she remains single or with them & I give to my daughter

I, Jos. Polley & Elizabeth my wife and grand daughter Phoebe Susan Carter, all of my stock of horses and so much of my cattle as may be thought necessary for their use and support the balance of my cattle to be sold. I give to my daughter Polley & Elizabeth my wife & grand daughter Phoebe Susan Carter so much of my money or money and bonds as may be necessary for their use to settle them on the above land and the balance of my money and bonds to be equally divided among my legal heirs at the death of my wife given under my hand and seal this 29th day of October 1835
