 of the County of Cumberland and State of Kentucky being  
 in a low state of health but of sound mind and memory  
 and wishing to bequeath my worldly Estate to my children,  
 do Ordain the following (writing) to be my last will and  
 Testament in manner and form following, to wit, First It is  
 my will and desire that after my death, so much of my Personal  
 Estate shall be sold, so as to pay off all my just debts and such  
 my son Ralph seventy five cents. My wife and daughter  
 legacies as will be hereafter mentioned. I give and bequeath to, to  
 my sons, Robert, John, Edward and Thomas and to my daughter Polly  
 the like sum of seventy five cents, to each, I give and bequeath  
 to my son William all that tract of land now live on  
 containing <sup>By Estimation</sup> One hundred and fifty acres together with  
 all my stock of Cattle, hogs and hoes, which may  
 be possessed of, and on the plantation when we shall die  
 and likewise all my house hold and kitchen furniture, and  
 in case of should die before the crop should be finished  
 it is my will and desire that my son Thomas should have  
 all that part of my crop which is now growing on the  
 North side of the River Cumberland and that my son William  
 should have all that part of which is on the South side
