Daniels Bowman appointed unto all men to die the uncertainty of life & certainty of death I do hereby give & bequeath unto my wife as to my estate that I have placed to my self with I distribute of as follows viz I Bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Cheathorn I do also give unto my daughter Nancy Cary a negro Boy named Dillon when the said Nancy comes to age she is to pay to the Estate \$100 I also give unto my daughter Sally a negro girl named Othaler & my Bed & furniture when the said Sally comes to age she is to pay to the Estate \$50 I give unto Daniel L Bowman my grand son \$50 I give unto John L Bowman as follows Three negroes two Boys & one woman named Ben & Pat and the names of the negroes given unto the said John L Bowman to gather with my hand that line on containing 150 acres all over my tools of all kinds all my house hold & kitchen furniture together with all my stock of all kind I appoint John L Bowman & Daniel L Bowman as my Executors in my will signed in the presence of us the 6<sup>th</sup> day of May 1825

Milley, Molly, Lindy & Jacob and their increase, and at his decease in the case that my mother shall be the longest liver, I lend to her during her natural life the above named negro slave Lindy and at the decease of my Father I give and bequeath to my brothers James, Joseph, David, Thomas, & Geo. Madison Baker to them and their heirs forever the following named slaves, to wit; Fanny, Charles, Milton, Wm. Milley & Lindy, and I give and bequeath to my Brother Daniel Baker, Molly and Jacob and in case that Fanny has no other Child or Children I give and bequeath Lindy to my five brothers before mentioned but in case she has a Child or Children I give and bequeath to my sister Margaret & I give and bequeath to my sister Susanah & Francis Baker and dollar to her and her heirs forever Lindy and her increase. I do hereby nominate, and do appoint my Father James Baker Executor of his my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand and seal, this 17<sup>th</sup> day of November 1829, acknowledged & subscribed in the presence of us
