

In the name of God Amen - I David Martin being weak in body though of sound mind and memory, calling to mind, the mortality of man, and that it is appointed once for all men to die, do ordain this my last will and testament as follows to wit, first - my will and desire is, that my beloved wife Mary Martin have the sole benefit of my interest in two tracts of land, the one whereon she now lives, and the other tract adjoining, of 42 acres and one half acre, during her natural life - Secondly - my will and desire is, that my children have all my lands, which I am possessed of in the State of Virginia, to be sold; and the money arising from said sale to be equally divided amongst them, that is to say my son Welcome Martin, John Martin and Nathaniel Martin and the heirs of James Martin deceased and Benjamin Martin and my daughters Lydia Smith and Hannah Staggs. Thirdly - my will is that the one half of the money arising from the sale of Bob a negro man, which is one hundred dollars in silver, which Sally Evans is ownd to me, to be equally divided between her children as they arrive to the age of twenty one, that is to say Sally Evans and David Evans, Peter Evans, H. Evans and Harriet Evans. Fourthly - I give to my step grand son David Evans (my big brother) when he arrives to the age of 21 - fifthly - I give to my beloved wife Mary Martin all the balance of my personal estate for the payment of my debts and her support during her natural life - Sixthly - my will is, that my interest in three town lots one lying in Tompkinsville, the in Martinsburgh, be sold, when my executors may think proper, and the money arising from the sales appropriated to the payment of my debts - Seventhly - I do appoint Samuel Wilson and Sally Evans my executors of this my last will and testament - signed, sealed and witnessed by us this 20 day of August 1824

To Adaline N. Semple are assigned 16th 17th 18th 19th 20th 21th 22th 23th 24th 25th 26th 27th 28th 29th 30th 31st 32nd 33rd 34th 35th 36th 37th 38th 39th 40th 41st 42nd 43rd 44th 45th 46th 47th 48th 49th 50th 51st 52nd 53rd 54th 55th 56th 57th 58th 59th 60th 61st 62nd 63rd 64th 65th 66th 67th 68th 69th 70th 71st 72nd 73rd 74th 75th 76th 77th 78th 79th 80th 81st 82nd 83rd including the improvements, and a ninth part of the big falls and 25 acres as aforesaid, for her part of the land, by paying \$1.57 Cent specie to the estate - and a negro man named Dary for her part of the slaves, by paying to the estate \$105.51 Cent specie and the sum of \$146.91 Cent Currency for her part of the personal estate - In the above division we have allowed no part of the hire of the negroes to James Semple, and only one eighth part of the present years hire to William H. Cheatham, as it appeared that they had received the use of a negro, each for their part.

We further state, that this division was agreed to by the said widow for herself, and as guardian for the infant heirs, and all the heirs who were of age at the time - all of which is respectfully submitted to the Court - November 10th 1824
